

We are Authors: Unit 1

Traditional fairy tales: How do authors use adjectives and adverbs to describe characters and setting?

Children will explore the magical world of fairy tales through reading, writing, drama, and creative activities. They will learn to identify key story features such as heroes, villains, and settings, and use imaginative language to describe characters and events. They will also develop their speaking and listening skills through storytelling and role-play, while building confidence in writing their own fairy tales using rich vocabulary.

We are Scientists: Unit 2

What do plants need to grow and stay healthy?

Children will explore the basic needs, parts, and life cycles of plants. They will learn to identify and name common plants and trees, understand the function of each plant part, and investigate what plants need to grow and stay healthy. They will observe how seeds and bulbs grow into mature plants. They will also use scientific vocabulary to describe their observations and record their findings.

We are Geographers: Unit 3

Why are some places cold and some hot?

Children will learn about the hot and cold areas of the world and begin to understand how climate varies in different parts of the Earth. They will explore where the Equator, North Pole, and South Pole are located on a globe or map, and discover how these locations affect temperature and weather. Children will compare life, animals, and environments in hot and cold places, and begin to understand how people adapt to different climates.

We are Designers: Unit 4

How can I make a moving picture using a slider or a lever?

Children will explore and evaluate a collection of books and everyday products that have moving parts, including those with levers and sliders. They will also design, make and evaluate their products at the end.

We are Artists: Unit 5

How can we turn everyday material into amazing 3D art?

Children will explore the basics of sculpture by creating their own 3D artworks. They will learn how to use and combine different elements of art, including colour, pattern, texture, line, shape, form, and space. They will experiment with tools and techniques to shape materials and express their ideas creatively through form.
